

Registration for leaders

All registrations are individual, registering and making the payment happen simultaneously through the BJAM 2026 website.

All patrol leaders must register before their patrol participants can register as all leaders must be approved by the NGO of their country. Once the leader's registration has been approved, the rest of the troop is able to sign up. All leaders must choose the correct ticket for their country, as indicated in the ticket shop.

All leaders must be at least 18 years old.

Each patrol has to have 1 leader and 10 participants. Leaders receive updates from the BJAM 2026 registration team about the participants in their patrol.



Registration for participants

HEDGEHOG



Do you remember meeting the hike-loving Adventurer in the first newsletter? Say hi to their friend **the Hedgehog**, who will bring you the introduction of our different hikes and the IST experience!

The Hedgehog is a nature guy through and through! When participating in a jamboree deep in the Estonian wilderness, a Hedgehog is the perfect companion to have. They are friends with animals and plants, not to mention fellow campers which makes them the ultimate trail guide, hiker and survivalist. As guides and scouts, the "Baltic Forest Festival" jamboree will be filled with them!

While a Hedgehog might be reserved and keep to themselves more, they are full of eternal fun facts and great stories. That's why a Hedgehog makes the perfect hiker or IST.

A hedgehog loves that the Baltic Forest Festival is set somewhere where there's lots to discover! Their favourite part might just be stargazing during the quiet hour, moving through the forest on their way to more calm, introspective activities and enjoying a hot tea in the participant cafe or IST subcamp.



HIKE

For the **regular hike**, participants will be split into **two age groups**. 11-13-year-olds will hike for about 14 kilometers, 14-15-year-olds for 18 kilometers.

The hike trail follows mostly forest paths and smaller gravel roads. All check-points are manned, in addition there are extra activities along the hike to gather extra points.

All groups have **10 participants**, a fantastic mix of Estonians, Latvians, Lithuanians, and other nationalities.

24H HIKE

The **24h hike** begins at the Tagametsa scouting campsite and ends at the Laose guiding campsite, with participants navigating with a given map with the intent of finishing in exactly 24 hours.

Each team has 5-6 members aged 16-17.

Everyone aged 16-17 is expected to participate, in exeptional cases it is possible to join the regular hike.

There are three exciting consecutive parts, each 8 hours long:

Biking

along even, but versatile terrain in the forest, on gravel roads and asphalt.



along the adventurous river Vigala, requiring great teamwork.

Hiking

on foot, which will mostly happen in the dark of the night using necessary safety gear.

IST EXPERIENCE

Join the festival!

As an IST member, you'll be at the heart of the jamboree. Long before the first participant arrives, you'll join the **pre-camp crew**, helping to build the campsite and prepare everything for hundreds of young guides and scouts. You'll set the stage for an amazing event and discover the magic of creating something big together.

Once camp begins, **IST is everywhere**:

- Delivering exciting programme activities
- Keeping the campsite and participants safe
- Giving a helping hand in the kitchen
- Supporting maintenance and building projects that keep camp running smoothly

No two days are the same, but one thing is certain:

Camp rules

- 1. Everyone follows the scouting and guiding law.
- 2. During quiet hour, the campsite must be silent and lights turned off. During night peace, everyone is in their tents.
- 3. Participants cannot charge their mobile phones.
- 4. Notify your sub-camp leader or camp staff of any rule breaking.
- 5. Short-time (up to 30 minutes) exit from the camp area can take place through the main gate with the permission from the group leader.
- 6. When leaving the campsite for more than 30 minutes, you must sign out at the information house.
- 7. Swimming rules apply to all campers, participants can only swim while accompanied by their patrol leader and must follow the instructions of the camp lifeguard.
- 8. Campers are not allowed to make fires or use open flames.
- 9. Trees cannot be felled for camp structures or for any other purpose.
- 10. All campers must wear their neckerchief and wristband at all times. It is forbidden to swap wristbands.
- 11. All campers have to follow the daily agenda.
- 12. All waste in the camp must be sorted according to Estonia's waste sorting rules. All the bins are labeled and have to be used accordingly.
- 13. Romantic or intimate relationships between adult camp staff (including ISTs) and campers under 18 are not allowed.

Camp rules

Safety, Prohibited Items, and Conflict Resolution

- 14. All items, substances, or behaviors unsuitable for a children's camp are strictly prohibited.
- 15. Problems should be reported to group leaders or camp staff, who will assist in mediating and resolving the situation.
- 16. In case of violations, involving the safety team if necessary, an incident report will be filed, and relevant authorities may be involved.

Health and First Aid Services at Camp

- 17. The camp has a First Aid and Mental Health Support Center, which can always be approached for professional assistance with health issues or for emotional support, also to make arrangement about medicine storing.
- 18. For more serious health or mental health incidents, a written report will be created. If necessary, the camper may be transported to the emergency room (EMO) or emergency services may be called to the camp.

Traffic Rules

19. Vehicle presence on the camp premises is strictly prohibited. Short-term presence of vehicles with special markings or permits is allowed only with the approval of the safety team.
